SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER **THOM REED**

Thom Reed is a Deputy Chief Genealogical Officer for FamilySearch International. His area of emphasis is African American records, research, and experiences. He also manages relationships with community, genealogical and historical organizations for people of African descent.

In 2015, Reed led FamilySearch's largest African American records project culminating in the free online access of Freedmen's Bureau records.

Currently, Reed is working in partnership with Matrix: The Center for Digital Humanities & Social Sciences at Michigan State University on "Enslaved: People of the Historic Slave Trade".
